

## FAITH ALONE

**READ:** Hebrews 11; Galatians 2:17-21

The biblical definition of faith is "Confidence in what we hope for; assurance about what we do not see." (Hebrews 11:1) Faith is the bedrock on which we stand in our relationship with God; believing in God; trusting in his promises; receiving this grace of God.

On our part, it is faith alone that makes us right with God. As Habakkuk 2:4b states, "The righteous person will live by his faithfulness." There is nothing more important in our life with God than our faith in his promises. Because we are human, faith is challenged by doubt and the brokenness of life. Faith falters when we look away from God to our own efforts or to the advancements of humanity through reason and logic. That's not to say that reason is not a gift from God. It is! We are created in the image of God and are to use all the gifts he has given us, including reason, which has provided all kinds of improvements for society at large. But human reason can never replace faith. Faith keeps us looking up to the one we were made to look up to. And when we place our faith in God, he himself counts that as the righteousness we need to live a life with him now on earth and forever in heaven!
