- 3) John 15:10 states, "If you keep my commands, you remain in my love." How is keeping what Jesus commanded His followers to do related to expressing love for Him?
- 4) Can you imagine Jesus commanding us, "Tolerate one another as I have tolerated you?" Reflections or comments?
- 5) According to the scripture readings above, what does Jesus command of us and how can that be applied to your life?
- 6) "Love one another as I have loved you." This is a radical command from Christ. Give examples of what this looks like in real life?
- 7) What actions do you need to take in your life to move from tolerating others to loving one another like Jesus?
