Apply God's Word to Your Life

- 1) 1 Corinthians 13 states, "Without love, faith that even moves mountains, is nothing; without love, even if I give everything away in service, I gain nothing." Why is love so central to who we are as followers of Jesus?
- 2) 1 John 4 states "God is love." What does it mean to you in practical terms, "To rely on the love that God has for us?"
- 3) In Matthew Jesus commands us, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." This is a radical and seemingly impossible command to put into practice. How can it be done? What steps can you take personally to move towards loving your enemies?
- 4) As you read through the scriptures above, what is the biggest takeaway for you personally?
- 5) Why do you think God commands us to focus on loving others and even our enemies? What's His goal for you in that command?
