God is a holy God. The holiness of God is not to be trifled with which means we, ourselves, must be made holy if we are to have a relationship with God. The big question is: Can you do that on your own as a broken, sinful human being? Too many people think that if they simply live a good life, they are holy in God's eyes. But they compare goodness to other human beings and not to the goodness of God. Therein is the problem for all human beings. As the Bible states, "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." See Romans 3:23. Can we ever be good enough for God by our own efforts? Can I ever reach a level of holiness that is acceptable to God? Thank God we don't have to solve the holiness problem through our own efforts. Jesus took on the role of the scapegoat to atone for the sins of people like you and me once and for all. The cross is the symbol of both our victory over sin through Christ, and the claim we have as a holy people before God. God in the cross of Christ makes us holy! Forgiven people are holy people. So, lift high the cross before you and surrender your life daily to His work in you.
