- 2. Can you recall moments in your life when you were courageous? What motivated you? Where do you think courage comes from?
- 3. Do you ever feel defeated in your faith walk? Have you faced something that was seemingly too big for your faith—something that shook your confidence in God?

Read Your Bible

- Ephesians 6:10-12

Apply God's Word to Your Life

- 1. What jumps out at you from God's statements to Joshua?
- 2. Joshua had lost his mentor and leader: Moses, the man who led Israel out of Egypt and to the Promised Land. Now Joshua was taking the reins. What things did God want him to know? How can you apply those to your own life?
- 3. In what areas do you find it hard to let God fight for you? How might courage help?
- 4. From the Ephesians verses, what battle are we truly swept into as followers of Christ? Who are we standing against? Who are we standing with?
- 5. What surprised the onlookers in Mark 1? What types of authority did Jesus show?
- 6. Prayer is a primary avenue of putting Christian faith into courageous action. Have you ever claimed Jesus' authority in your life—over evil, fear, or sin? Have you ever asked God for courage or asked Him to fight for you? You can start today!
