### Apply God's Word to Your Life

2. How will God respond to their destruction?
3. What are the attributes of the king whom God will raise up?
4. While the attributes that God speaks, are that of the king, how can you embody those godly qualities?
5. Christians believe that God ultimately fulfilled this promise in Jesus. In the reading from Matthew, who are the religious people, and who are the sinners?
6. Who is Jesus interacting with the most?
7. What analogy does Jesus use to describe himself and his ministry?
8. Read Hosea 6:6. How does Jesus use this text to oppose the religious leaders, and as a blessing for those far from God?

The words from Jeremiah have us ask two painful questions. First, "when have I been led down the wrong path." The second is like it, except more terrifying, "when have I led others down the wrong path?" Both questions makes us squirm as we must admit that we have often been led and have led others astray.
