Frequently the church phone rings, and the person on the other end of the line is at the end of their rope. We're their last chance for refuge from a bitter cold and restless night. They need a place to stay. They've been evicted. Often, it's an entire family; mom, dad, and children. How do we care for them? What does Jesus ask of us? How can we help?

Hope has great ministry partners to help us care for the homeless in Jesus' name. Churches United for the Homeless and the New Life Center are fantastic ministries that help us make sure that people have shelter and can help people move beyond this crisis. Without their ministries many people would die, and even more would not know about Jesus and his compassion and love.

Ash Wednesday on February 26 kicks off the season of Lent. During this season, we are asking the people of Hope to dig deep with compassion and love, a Jesus-like love and give to a special offering in support of these two ministries. Envelopes for giving will be available in the church hallways, from ushers, and in the Church Office. Text giving is another method to show generosity.

Jesus' words remind us of the great responsibility we have in caring for people, and the joy of doing so. In Matthew's Gospel Jesus speaks to caring for people on the margins of life and said, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." 

In turn, this simple act of risk-taking and surrender makes room for the richest rewards. "Showing up" at camp lets them start to rethink and recharge in a gorgeous Northern Minnesota setting. They get a taste of wilderness— Camp House seems a bit rustic when we pull up! They get a lot of worship— morning and evening devotions and group times are one of the best things about Camp. They embrace beauty and adventure, swimming in Lake Superior and hiking through Gooseberry Falls. They get real relationships and friendships that will define the coming year.





What is CAMP HOUSE?

Three summers ago, nine students and a few leaders took a risk. They committed to a brand-new High School retreat: five days at a quiet camp an hour north of Duluth. They came back changed and the retreat became a favorite. By last summer, we were up to 60 students and joined forces with another 20 from Oak Grove High School. This year, we're sharing the week with Oak Grove again, but reserving 80 spots for HSM— planning to fill the Camp to capacity!

We keep the cost low, but students still give up some things to go: their routines, their beds, five days of summer and reliable cell phone service! In return, they get to unplug from the drama of relationships and the hum of daily stress. They hit pause on busy schedules back home and all the things we take for granted in life. Whether they realize it or not, they are taking a step in obedience to Jesus' command: "Come away with me and rest awhile." (Mark 6:31)



So, why are students passionate about a five-hour bus ride and some acres of land on a private lake? Why do we as leaders call it "the best place on earth"?





Most of all, we, students and leaders alike, take daily opportunities to uncover next steps with Jesus. We learn to walk with Him, worship together, pray for one another. We learn to be loved and to laugh like we mean it. Students find themselves rekindling their faith and forging real, vulnerable relationships. Leaders find themselves breathing fresh air and recommitting their own devotion to God in the wild peace of His creation.



Probably because, year after year, God makes room for us to meet with Him and to see with fresh eyes all that He has for us. Going into our fourth year of the retreat, I say, we all need a Camp House!


