We simply need to follow the advice of the medical experts who tell us that large gatherings need to be canceled for the health and safety of all. The last thing we want to happen at Hope is that our life-giving church could be a setting for the spread of the disease.

Having suspended all gatherings at Hope does not mean we are putting off helping you with your soul business. In fact, we have a history of streaming worship services and I want to encourage you to take advantage of LIVE services streamed this week on both Wednesday at 6:00pm and a different service streamed live on Sunday at 9:30am. Wednesday's service will have Pastor Paul preaching on prayer and given the anxiety and fear embracing our world I can't think of a better practice than engaging prayer at this time. On Sunday, Pastor Chuck will be preaching on being a follower of Jesus in a pandemic.

Some of you are already familiar with Hope's streaming services. For those who have not streamed our worship services, please note that we offer 6:00pm on Wednesday and 9:30am on Sunday.
