# Re-opening Information and Guidelines

People of Hope,

Gathering together for worship as followers of Jesus Christ is a Holy privilege and one of our greatest joys. This season of responding to the realities of COVID-19 has been a real challenge for churches everywhere as we seek to worship together. I am deeply thankful for the technology that has allowed us to gather together even though we are apart. It is important and will continue to be a key worship opportunity. As we begin to re-open the physical facilities (church) that the people of God gather together in, here are some important considerations (subject to change) for our safety:

## PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING

Please wash your hands. Hand sanitizing stations will be available at multiple places in our facilities. Thorough sanitizing and cleaning will be done between services and ministries.

These considerations have been developed by our leadership. As a large congregation that gathers all generations together regularly it is important that we be wise in our procedures and practices.

I fully recognize that we all have different comfort levels and personal considerations regarding gathering together. We will continue to live stream worship and offer online opportunities for children, youth and adults. Please engage our online opportunities if you are vulnerable or have concerns.

I also understand that we can not fully eliminate the potential for COVID-19 transmission. Our goal is to mitigate the possibility as best we can.

This is a stressful time. We live with a lot of difficult decisions, conflicting news and deeply divided people over a myriad of issues. Our world is broken.
