4. Our Gospel text from Matthew is a scary text for most. People are calling Jesus “Lord” and yet missing out on the Kingdom of God. What were they missing?
5. If you were to write Matthew 7:21-23 in your own words what would you say?
6. The key phrase in the Matthew text is Jesus saying, “I never knew you.” How do we allow ourselves to be known by Jesus? Check out Revelation 3:20.
7. What difference has faith made in your life?
