Apply God's Word to Your Life

3. "Actions speak louder than words" is a true statement and certainly what Jesus was alluding to in the Gospel text. What actions have you experienced from others that have revealed to you about their character?
4. What do your actions toward others tell them about your character?
5. Can someone see your faith in your actions?

6. Our faith is not about looking for proof, but it will always be a matter of faith. Faith comes first, and then there is evidence of faith. Faith transforms us, changes us from the inside out. In what areas of your life has faith changed you?
