# **Apply God's Word to Your Life**

- 1. Titus 1:15-16 describes two categories of people. How do they relate differently to God?
- 2. Have you personally ever been in the second category, "corrupted" and "denying Him by your actions"? What was it like?
- 3. Matthew 23 records the seven woes that Jesus pronounced against the religious leaders at the time. They are God's lament at finding the leaders of His people so rebellious and clueless. What stands out to you?
- 4. Could any of these woes apply to us or to our leaders today?
- 5. What is Jesus' desire as expressed in verses 37-39? What is the remedy to the woes He pronounced?
- 6. Are there places in your life where you've been a hypocrite? Are you willing to lay it down at the foot of the cross?

#### **Conclusion**

The New Testament brings the scandalous story of Jesus' mission to reclaim lost people. He takes rebels like you and me and makes us holy like Him. That restoration is whole-hearted, it takes broken sinners and makes them wide-eyed saints. While we still fall short, we are warned that hypocrisy is one of the strongest attacks we can make against His work in us. It is when we act or pretend to honor God on the "outside" while being inwardly "dead" towards Him. This cuts close to home for all of us. Jesus takes such time to indict it because, when we easily lie to ourselves, we also hinder others from seeing truth. Taken far enough, self-deceiving sin can corrupt both mind and conscience again, like we'd never known Jesus. But fear not, our Savior is much greater than our sin! Grace calls us to a simple repentance that kills the hypocrisy in us. The woes of Matthew 23 are a great opportunity to let the Holy Spirit examine what's on the inside. "Where is the hypocrisy in me and how can I lay it down at the foot of the cross?"

# **Pray**
