Apply God's Word to Your Life

1. The word for peace used in Isaiah 9:6 is the Hebrew word, "shalom," which can also be understood as meaning harmony, wholeness, completeness, prosperity, safety and contentment. How does "shalom" align or differ from your current understanding of "peace?"
2. Name some ways Jesus embodies "shalom."
3. In John 14:27, he tells us that he gives us and leaves us with his peace. In what ways does the peace Jesus offers different from the peace of the world?
4. In your relationship with Jesus, when was a time you experienced peace ("shalom")?
5. In Philippians 4:6-8 Paul suggests that even in the midst of anxiety or any situation that God can give us peace through Jesus. Where in your life or the world around you do you need the assurance of the unshakable love and salvation of God in Jesus?

Conclusion

Jesus is the Prince of Peace – shalom – the one who makes us right with God (harmony), who has the power to heal and restore our broken place (wholeness/completeness), who offers us salvation (safety) and makes us inheritors of God’s kingdom (prosperity). In Jesus all our soul’s needs are met for our daily living (contentment).
