additional pillars as free-standing monuments to the power and the glory of God. He adorned the top of the pillars with intricate pomegranate and lilies—too high for humans to appreciate—as an act of worship. One thousand years later, when the Chaldeans destroyed the temple, they toppled the pillars. They discovered hundreds of intricate pomegranates carved into the bronze and carried them back to their country. Huram's excellence became a witness to an unbelieving nation that God is worthy of worship. How can our excellence inspire others to know our great God?
