Life Point

Jesus healed sickness and diseases because He is God's Son.

We appreciate YOU!

S (Scripture) O (Observation) A (Application) P (Prayer) and Memory Verse

Observation:

1. How many men met Jesus on His way to Jerusalem? (ten)
2. What was wrong with the men? (leprosy-a skin disease)
3. What did the lepers call out to Jesus? ("Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!")
4. What did Jesus tell the men to do? (go show themselves to the priests)
5. What did Jesus do for the men? (healed them)
6. How many men came to thank Jesus? (one)

Application:

Start by asking the kids "Why do you think the nine men went on their way and only one man came back to Jesus to thank Him? Well – the Bible doesn't tell us why the nine men didn't stop and say thank you, but the Bible does tell us a little about the man who did come back. Luke 19 says that Jesus told the man that his faith had healed him. That means the man believed in Jesus!

Not only did Jesus have the power to make the men healthy and clean on the inside – just as He does for people today. When people trust in Jesus as Savior and Lord, they are completely forgiven from sin and can begin a brand-new life. (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Prayer:

If possible, have a time of silence and let kids have time in prayer. Praying for someone who is sick. Tell them you will close in prayer when time is up. "Thank you, Jesus, for showing us your power through miracles. Ask God to lead each child to come to believe in Jesus and trust in Him as their Savior. Thank you, God, for the eternal life we will receive through our belief and trust in Him as our Lord and Savior.

Memory Verse:

Find John 6:38 and challenge kids to name: the testament where they can find the verse (New) and the division where they can find the verse (Gospels). Ask them if they know what the word Gospel means (good news).

Memory Verse:

"For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me."

Bible Skills: Try to find a verse that you can write in your Bible Memorization Cards holder for later reference. One that will encourage you or shows gratitude.

Live it Out!

Today we will be making cards for people who are sick. Distribute the white paper squares. Guide kids to fold the paper in half horizontally, vertically, and then diagonally. Cut notches and shapes along each edge to create paper snowflakes. Glue onto card. Write an encouraging message on the inside. They could use the verse they found in the beginning of the hour. We will be giving these to people from HLC who are hospitalized or if the kids have someone who they know is sick, they can take them with them.
