Conclusion

At a first glance, this commandment seems to be all about what we should not do. We should not use the name of God in ways that are destructive, disrespectful, or dishonoring. Certainly, our culture has lost a reverence for the name of God. It is used in hurtful and demeaning ways casually every day. We should turn from this. The ancient Hebrew people believed that the name of God was so holy they would not speak it out loud. Instead, they used words like *Elohim*, meaning God or *Adonai*, meaning Lord. What the Hebrews knew was that God is holy and eternal, bigger than this world and His name should be used sparingly, purposefully and with profound respect. The name of God is to be used to call on, spoken because Jesus is the salvation of the world. The Apostle Paul reminds us of this. There is salvation in the name of God. Calling on Him as our savior brings us into eternal life. We use His name, not casually or irreverently, but with hope in who He is – Savior and Lord.
