In the Small Catechism he wrote this commandment means, “We are to fear, love, and trust God above anything else.” The calling is to place God first in all things. Like the rich young man who had everything, it is difficult to sometimes see that our affluence makes us put ourselves in the center, not God. Only the cross can free us from this ego trap and restore us into a right relationship with God.
