- 3. When was the last time you intentionally took a whole day to rest?

Read Your Bible

- Deuteronomy 5:12-15
- Mark 2:24-28

Apply God's Word to Your Life

- 1. Sabbath in Hebrew means "to rest." In Deuteronomy, Israel is commanded to weekly observe a day of rest. How is a day of rest a gift from God?
- 2. How might a day of rest feel like a burden?
- 3. In Deuteronomy 5 what is the reason given for keeping the Sabbath?
- 4. If the Sabbath is a day for us to give "to the Lord," what sort of activities would honor and highlight God's goodness, provision and salvation?
- 5. In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus says that the Sabbath was created for man, not man for the Sabbath. Why does this distinction matter?
- 6. Why would it be good for a person's soul and life to observe a whole day of Sabbath "for the Lord?"
- 7. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel writes, "Sabbath is the most precious present humankind has received from the treasure house of God." (*The Sabbath,* New York: Farrar, Straus, and Giroux, 1951) What holds you back from receiving God's gift of Sabbath?
- 8. Imagine if you were able to spend a whole day resting with the Lord, how would you spend that time?

It's hard to imagine in our fast-paced world taking a whole day once a week to give to the Lord. The demands and pressures of life build up. Reasons to push God and rest to the sidelines increase. God created the Sabbath to help us find rest from daily pressures, regain perspective and be renewed by the Holy Spirit.
