

On the Rock

Introduction:

In our text for today, Jesus ends his sermon from the side of a mountain. It is the longest public discourse of Jesus that we have recorded in the Gospels, and it is packed full of wisdom for faith and life. He leaves us with a final metaphor.

He says that if we hear his words, and put them into practice, then we will be like a house built on a solid rock. When the storms and floods of life come, the house will stand, because the foundation is secure. Another way to look at this is that the teachings of Jesus are useless if they are not applied to our life. God's word is not simply for reading, it is for living out our days.

What good is a college education if it is not put into practice? What benefit does a coach have on a team if their instruction is not followed? Listen and plan to put God's words into practice!
