Introduction:

"Come Lord Jesus be our Guest and let these gifts to us be blessed. Amen."

A simple table prayer, but incredibly profound in meaning and sentiment. As we celebrate
Thanksgiving this week and look towards Advent, in this prayer we ask Jesus to come, be among
us. And while we offer the gift of hospitality at our table for Jesus in prayer, it is His holy
presence that we are truly seeking and needing. The holidays can be hard for some, especially if
there is someone missing from the table this year, and Jesus promises to be with us, among us,
whether we're alone (Matthew 28:20) or whether we gather with others in his name (Matthew
18:20). When we welcome Jesus' presence, we welcome the light and love of God our souls long
for. Jesus then opens our hearts to see that ALL we have, the extraordinary and the ordinary
things of life, are all gifts from God and we are blessed. He is present, we are aware and our
hearts open in gratitude and love. What a blessing indeed!
