Introduction:

The Bible is full of accounts of people who saw the resurrected Jesus. He spoke to them. He ate with them. They recognized him. The resurrected Jesus is an essential piece of God's Good News for the world.

It is easy for modern readers to think that it was simpler for the people in the first century to come to grips with a risen Jesus. This is not the case. It was just as difficult for a person in the first century as it is for a 21st century person to believe. This is why scripture gives us these accounts, so that the faith of Jesus' followers might become our faith.

When we look at the first witnesses, we see a mix of reactions, but ultimately a picture of what it means to believe and to know and to rest firmly in the promise that God raised his son to new life, and he will do the same for us. Then, we too, are to be witness to what we have come to believe. We are to tell of what we have seen with eyes of faith.
