

Root Deep

Introduction

If you've ever gathered firewood, have you noticed which branches burn up most quickly? The dry ones that haven't been connected to the tree in a long time. They snap when bent, and there are no signs of life inside. On the contrary, the branches connected to the tree are hard to burn up and hard to break. Even if you tear them from the tree, their plant veins remain green with nutrients for around a week.

In John 15, Jesus tells us, "'I am the vine; you are the branches.'" When we are disconnected from God's Word, we become spiritually dry and snap easily. Yet, when we are deeply rooted in God's word, we gain the nutrients we need to become alive in Christ and bear the fruit of His Holy Spirit. Understanding the depth of Christ's love, as described in Ephesians 3:18, is crucial for remaining in Him. Being "rooted and established in love" (Ephesians 3:17), we are filled with "all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19). As the love of God flows through us, we are able to more fully love one another (John 15:17).

5. In practical terms, what does bearing fruit look like for a Christian? How does Ephesians 3:20-21 encourage us in this aspect?
6. How do the themes of love and unity in Ephesians 3 and John 15 challenge us to live differently in community?
7. What steps can we take to ensure that our spiritual roots are deep and strong?
