Introduction

Our faith is personal, but it is not private. We are ambassadors of the good news of Jesus Christ. In Matthew 5:16 Jesus instructs us to “let your light so shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.”

How do you shine a light for Christ? When we live out faith in word, speech, and conduct, by aligning our lives to God’s word and will, we shine brightly for him. We bear witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus in the way that we allow others to see how God has forgiven, healed, and redeemed us. We pray that God would make us bold witnesses, not ashamed of the gospel, to all who will hear. We pray for opportunities to witness to all people, including those most often overlooked, as Jesus did.

Zacchaeus was one such soul. A despised man who was seen as a traitor to his people for collecting taxes for the Roman Empire. A man who made his wealth by collecting exorbitant taxes from the hard working and the poor. He is the man that Jesus notices. Jesus, it seems, does not see the cultural labels we put on each other, instead, in Zacchaeus, he saw a man hungry for the grace and truth of God.
