## VISION

As the people of Hope we exist to encourage all people to know the love of Christ. HSM aims to be a place for all high schoolers to grow in and know His love that is to be shared with others.

#### **HEART OF THE MINISTRY**

We desire to anchor the hearts and minds of or our students in Christ as they prepare for their next steps into adulthood after graduation for a lifelong faith. We pray that HSM becomes a Christian community that roots itself in His Word, meaningful conversations, and uplifting prayer.

## **CURRICULUM**

Our curriculum is developed to deepen and strengthen their personal relationship with God with emphasis on diving into scripture and prayer alongside community. We know that if our students are securely connected to Christ as their source of light, then they won't be able to help but be the light of Christ for their family, friends, and the world around them.

## **WEEKLY PROGRAMMING**

A typical HSM gathering on Wednesdays consists of three key components:

- Small Group A space for personal reflection, discussion, and connection.
- Large Group A time of worship, teaching, and shared experience.
- Hangout Time An opportunity for students to build community through fellowship.

Each campus and grade level may have slight variations in structure:

- 9th Grade Groups North & South typically begin in small groups at 7:15pm and transition to large group at 7:45pm, wrapping up by 8:15pm, followed by optional hangout time.
- Upperclassmen may adjust their schedule based on availability, sometimes meeting for small groups
  after large group.
- West Campus HSM currently combines large group with Middle School Ministry (MSM), so they start with large group before breaking into small groups, maintaining the 8:15pm end time.
- All buildings close at 9:30pm, ensuring students wrap up their time together by then.

# **GROWING IN FAITH**

Outside of weekly programming, high school students (entering grades 9-12) are encouraged to attend our FUEL Retreat at Camp House (Brimson, MN) at least once during their high school years. This retreat allows students to disconnect from everyday life and experience their relationship with God in a deep and meaningful way. This retreat is also filled with lake time, North Shore adventures, and loads of joy housed in fun camp traditions!

### **GROWING IN COMMUNITY**

When regular programming is off, Summer Bonfires are on! This weekly event is filled with community, yard games, and s'mores of course! This is a great time to invite friends and make new ones! Weekly bonfires are hosted at our South Campus firepit from 7:15pm. Stay tuned for some opportunities for student led Bible studies this summer, too!

# **GROWING IN SERVICE**

Youth Worship is a place for all 6-12<sup>th</sup> graders (regardless of musical abilities) to grow their heart in worship while developing their musical abilities. Students are invited to be part of weekly rehearsals and serve on youth worship teams leading their peers in worship during MSM & HSM programming.
