<ol> <li>Open the Bible to the Table of Contents.</li> <li>Put the first five books on the bookshelf. (Genesis-Deuteronomy)         The first five books of the Bible are all written by Moses. They are called the Books of the Pentateuch/Law.</li> <li>Put the next 12 books on the bookshelf. (Joshua-Esther)         These are 12 history books which follow the story of Israel.</li> <li>Put the next five books on the shelf. (Job-Song of Solomon)         These five books are poetical books relating to Israel's spiritual life. Thye are called the books of Poetry.</li> <li>Put the next five books on the shelf. (Isaiah-Daniel)         These five books are the teachings of the major prophets. Called "Major" because of their longer length.</li> <li>Lastly, put the next 12 books on the shelf. (Hosea-Malachi)         These are the teachings of the "Minor" prophets.</li> <li>The major and minor prophets were written as teachings and calls to repentance by prophets chosen by God.</li> </ol>

Observation Questions	Talk about stewardship.
	A steward is a person who manages
	something but does not own it. For
	example, Chick-Fil-A. There is a manager
	who takes care of the store for the
	owner.
	What would happen if the manager
	did not take good care of the
	store? (fired, laid off, written up,
	etc.)

	How we use our things, and our lives, is
	called stewardship. We are like
	managers. We manage our lives and our
	things. We don't get "fired" if we misuse
	our things, but we do usually have
	consequences.
	2. Can you think of times you have
	misused your things, time or
	yourselves? What were the
	consequences?
	Tell the students: God wants the best for
	you, and God knows that you will be
	happier if you make good choices with
	your things, time, and self. God wants us
	to practice good stewardship. But how
	do we know if we are being good
	stewards?

Activity	<ol> <li>Icebreaker Games:         <ol> <li>Group Storytelling – is a game where you start a story with a sentence and each person adds a sentence to continue the story.</li> <li>Superhero Alter Ego – ask students if they were a superhero, what would their power be and their name?</li> <li>Fun Fact – you will have each student write a fun fact about themselves on a pos-it.
