## Vision

# **Heart of the Ministry**

# **Weekly Format**

Our weekly format comes with some flexibility based on the needs of your group!

#### 7:15-7:45pm | Small Group or Hangout Time

Many 9th-grade groups may choose to meet for small group first to allow for an earlier parent pick-up. Ultimately, it's up to you to decide what works best for your group!

#### 7:45-8:30pm | Large Group

This includes announcements, worship and a message.

#### 8:30-9:30pm | Small Group or Hangout Time

Groups that didn't meet earlier can use this time for small group until finished or until closing. Students who had small group earlier are welcome to hang out and enjoy fellowship time until they have a ride or until closing. \*The building closes at 9:30 PM.

#### **Campus Specific Locations:**

- North Campus meets in the basement for hangout time, small group, and large group
- <u>South Campus</u> meets in the Sanctuary for large group, Discovery Center for hangout time and may spread throughout the church as rooms are available for small group (no assigned location)
- West Campus meets in the Sanctuary for large group and room 103 for hangout. Small groups may utilize the building, as available.

#### Curriculum

Curriculum for High School Ministry follows the "Hope Lectionary," as utilized throughout youth ministry and our Deeply Rooted groups. It has also been developed to work on either side of large group depending on your group's preference. Each student and leader will be provided with a "HSM Weekly Journal" each semester, which includes the small group content and space for reflection. While no formal preparation is needed on your part; reading through the text for the week and/or listening to our Deeply Rooted podcast may help enrichen your conversations.

We ask that all small group guides take attendance each week. For our 9th graders, this helps us track their progress toward Confirmation requirements. It also allows us to follow up with students who have been absent for a few weeks and offer support and encouragement.

# **Grow in Faith, Community & Service**

From our annual FUEL Retreat at Camp House each summer to our monthly worship and prayer nights, we love giving students opportunities to grow deeper in their faith and get connected to a community that goes beyond Wednesday nights. ## Confirmation

Confirmation is the rite of passage where students confirm who they say Jesus is and become adult members of God's Church, following four years of focused Christian instruction spanning sixth to ninth grade. At Confirmation held each May, eligible students confirm their faith in Jesus Christ, fulfilling the baptismal promises that parents, grandparents, godparents, and guides had been keeping for them until now.
